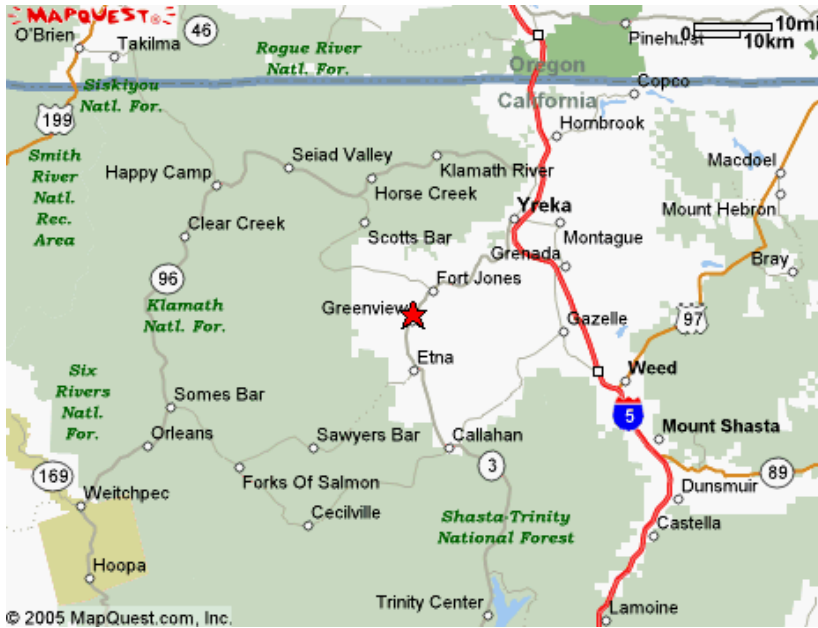

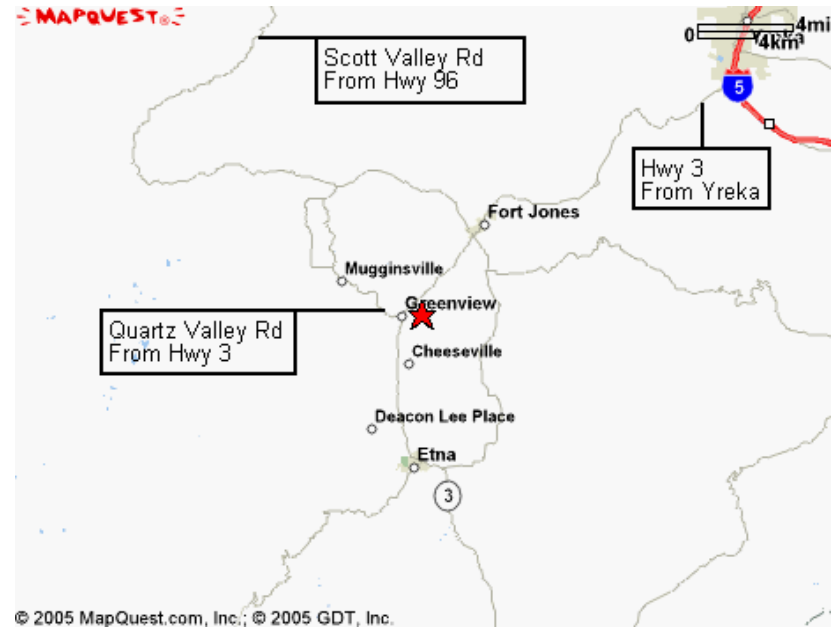

Directions:

From Yreka (I-5) - Head South on Hwy 3. Travel approximately 20 miles from the Wal Mart store and turn right onto Quartz Valley Road.

From Horse Creek (Hwy 96) – Head South on Scott River Road. Travel approximately 39 miles to Fort Jones, turn right onto Hwy 3. Travel approximately 4.5 miles and turn right onto Quartz Valley Road.

From Trinity Center (Hwy 3) – Head North on Hwy 3 over the Scott Mountains. Turn left at the Callahan-Gazelle Road/Hwy 3 and travel approximately 20 miles to Greenview. Turn left onto Quartz Valley Road.
